Words with ible suffix

- -ible words come from Latin
- When a word ends in -ible, it's less likely that the part before the ending (root word)
 will be a recognisable English word. Take permissible or audible, for example:
 'permiss' and 'aud' are not English words.
- However, this is only a guideline and there are exceptions to this. E.g. accessible and collapsible both end in -ible even though they are formed from the recognisable words access and collapse.
 - Like with '-able', we drop the 'e' with -ible e.g. collapse + ible = collapsible
- Words ending in c have a softer sound with -ible: forcible. Notice we drop the 'e' in force -ible = forcible.

Where there is no recognisable root word, I have added the suffix for you. Where you have to follow the rules above, you will have to add the suffix yourself.

For any words you are unsure about, please make sure you look up the definition in a dictionary.
