All tasks are to be uploaded by **Wednesday 9th December**, after this date we will be looking at the photos on Tapestry and encouraging our child to talk to us about what they did and what they learnt. <u>Numeracy</u> Complete some of the numeracy games on our Reception class webpage to support numeracy skills for this term.	<u>Food Glorious Food</u> Learn a song about food. Practice it ready to perform for us in class. You might like to make up some actions or dance to go with your song.	<u>Minibeasts</u> After half term we will be reading a story about ants. Learn about, draw and label pictures of 5 minibeasts that you don't already know about.	<u>Make a Boat</u> Use any materials you like (junk modelling, wood, lego, play dough etc) to make a boat to cross the river. You could make a ship, a rowing boat, a yacht, a submarine - let your imagination run wild!
<u>Literacy</u> Complete some of the Literacy games on our Reception class webpage to support reading and writing skills for this term.	<u>Collage</u> Make us a collage of your favourite meal. You can draw, paint and stick to make us a textured picture of your meal. Remember to write your name on it.	<u>House Numbers</u> What number house do you think the Gingerbread Man might live at? Go for a walk in your local area and look at the different house numbers. Take photos of the different numbers you see. What do you notice about these numbers?	<u>Write a Story</u> Create a story based around a favourite traditional tale. You could change the characters or the setting. You can illustrate your story and have a go at writing some of the words. You may need some grown up help to add most of the words to your story.
<u>Play a Board Game</u> Choose your favourite board game and have lots of fun playing it with your family and friends. If you'd like to borrow one from school just come and ask. You could take picture of you playing and bring it in for us to see!	<u>Turn Yourself into a Story Character</u> We are learning about the story of <i>The Gingerbread Man</i> . Dress up, or draw yourself as a character from a traditional tale. Upload a photograph onto Tapestry.	<u>Packed Lunch</u> Design and make a packed lunch for The Gingerbread Man to take on a picnic. Wash your hands first, learn how to use tools safely and think about including lots of healthy and tasty food!	<u>Free Choice</u> This activity is a free choice. You can choose an area of interest that is linked to our topic of <i>What's Your Favourite Food?</i> Will you make a model? Write a story? Create a non-fiction booklet? Make a map? Build something? Use technology?
