<u>English/Maths games</u> Complete some of the Maths or English challenges on Sumdog.	<u>Art and design</u> Draw and label an ocean dwelling creature and add some interesting facts.	<u>Science</u> This term we are looking at 'food groups' and healthy eating. Can you create a healthy meal? You could draw it or even ask a grown up to help you make it. Remember to think about which food groups you have included in your meal!	<u>ICT/English</u> Research your favourite aquatic animal. What do they eat? Where do they live? Do they have any special adaptations? Create a PowerPoint to show to your class.
<u>Play a game</u> Play a game of Battleships. Take photos. Perhaps you could have a Battleship championship with your family? Who will be victorious?	<u>Music</u> Create a song or a rap to help people understand about how the ocean is being damaged. Could you perform it to your class?	<u>Geography/ICT/Maths</u> Where have you been in the United Kingdom and where would you like to go? Show this on a map.	<u>Free Choice</u> This activity is a free choice. You can choose an area of interest that is linked to our topic. Then decide on how you want to show your learning. Will you make a model? Write a story? Create a non-fiction booklet? Make a map? Build something? Create something? Use ICT? Work with others or independently? Decisions!! Decisions!!
<u>Geography</u> Use a blank map of the UK. Can you locate the 4 countries and their capitals? Could you locate somewhere in the UK that you have visited?	<u>Art and design/English</u> Design and create a poster persuading people to help save the ocean.	<u>English</u> Create a fact file about a kind of animal that lives under the sea. Remember to include sub-headings, lots of facts and a picture.	<u>Longer Project</u> Design and create your own under water kingdom. Think about what you know about the sea and use this to help you. What will your under water kingdom look like? Who will live there? You could draw it, build it with cardboard, play dough or clay, or even design it on a computer.
